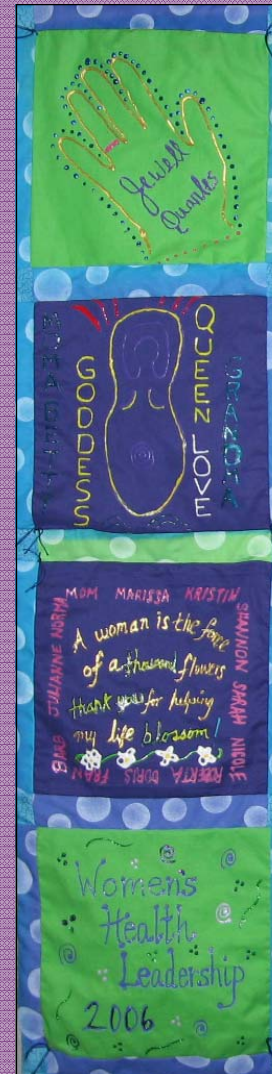

WOMEN'S HEALTH LEADERSHIP

Expanding the leadership capacity of women leaders for community change.



Women's Health Leadership (WHL) promotes health and social justice by supporting grassroots women leaders. Since 1994, over 350 women have graduated from WHL; these leaders represent over 75% of California's 59 counties in 22 specific ethnic cultures.

Among many benefits, participants will:

- Participate in a unique model for women's leadership development.
- Receive training on topics such as collaboration, communication, and community advocacy.
- Take part in efforts to improve women's health.
- Have access to a statewide network of leaders.

Selected women leaders must be able to:

- Commit to a year-long program consisting of a diverse set of activities.
- Attend four two-day retreats in the Greater Sacramento Area.
- Complete a learning project.
- Make a financial commitment of \$500 for the entire series of retreats. Participants are also responsible for arranging and funding their own travel and lodging.
